Founded in 2008, Brix Bounty Farm focuses on the promotion and production of nutrient dense foods. Central to this mission are efforts to improve food security through community projects that increase knowledge and awareness of sustainable production techniques on farms and in backyard and community gardens. Brix Bounty works with local non-profits and community groups to bridge the connection between soil, diet, and health.

Brix Bounty Apprenticeships: Production apprenticeships begin in March/April and run through October. Minimum ~10 hour per week commitment. Experience and learn about sustainable crop production through a season-long apprenticeship. Our apprenticeship program includes access to farm fresh produce, an extensive training program, and agricultural mentorship. Urban agriculture apprenticeships opportunities may also available. *Note: our paid positions are filled for 2011; but we do have a few part-time positions available.

Brix Bounty Mini-Apprenticeships: Brix Bounty offers mini-apprenticeships for a shorter period of time (6-8 weeks minimum). Mini-apprenticeships are about building skills and knowledge for the participants related to the season. Fresh produce, participation in an extensive training program, and agricultural mentorship are exchanged for labor. Mini-apprenticeships start on a rolling basis throughout the growing season.

Research Opportunities/Internships: Join in existing farm research focusing on food systems, soil health, and nutritional quality or develop your own research project in cooperation with Brix Bounty Farm.

Community Education Internship: Assist in the production of the farm's educational programming on the Southcoast and eastern Massachusetts: Know Your Vegetables, Roots Down - New Bedford, and more.

Free monthly **workshops** in local areas focusing on small-scale production. Contact the farm for more info.
