Brix Bounty Farm – Resources for Composting and Irrigation

Composting has many benefits, including:

1) Reducing the amount of waste entering our solid waste stream – i.e. landfills or incinerators.

2) Creating a natural fertilizer to help improve our garden soils.
3) Improving the availability of nutrients from other natural sources, i.e. – rock amendments (soft rock phosphate, greensand, etc.).



The basic keys to composting are to strive for the appropriate carbon/nitrogen ratio (browns to greens).
